ABOUT THE PATIENT NAVIGATOR TRAINING COLLABORATIVE (PNTC)

PNTC is a training program dedicated to improving the knowledge and skills of patient navigators. It is a partnership between the University of Colorado Denver's Center for Public Health Practice, Denver Prevention Training Center, Red Rocks Community College and trainers and experts around the state of Colorado.

UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY

The PNTC seeks experienced individuals to participate in developing the future Colorado patient navigator workforce by expanding our faculty in order to provide workshops around Colorado and to diversify the trainer pool.

Interested individuals must be willing to commit to being trained on the curriculum, prepare for training, and deliver the 3 day workshop in the person's region with assistance from PNTC.

Position Summary

Trainers will deliver patient navigator training on basic communication, health promotion and professional conduct skills required by new patient navigators in order to build competencies among the varied workforce in Colorado. Trainers follow curriculum training guides and fulfill fidelity requirements. Furthermore, they will assist with promoting courses to potential students throughout the region and serve as a Patient Navigator Training Collaborative representative.

Minimum Qualifications

Experience:

- Current or past experience as a patient navigator or experience in health education or care coordination
- Experience with public speaking, training, or group education
- Desire to lead interactive and participatory courses
- Has attended the Patient Navigator Fundamentals level One course within the past 18 months (if not, will need to attend an August, September, or October workshop)

Preference:

- Working knowledge and experience with adult learning theory
- Experience with interactive learning
- Experience working in the following arenas: rural areas, people with disabilities, mental health, or Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender communities

Essential Duties & Responsibilities:

- Attend a Training-of-Trainers workshop in mid-October 2015
- Conduct the 3 day Patient Navigator Basic Fundamentals 1-2 times per year
- Co-train with a professional trainer
- Follow trainer guide and complete fidelity requirements
- Communicate with program on planned trainings, registrations and completed trainings

Trainers will be reimbursed for travel to the training-of-trainers workshop and for time spent during the training. Each trainer will also be reimbursed for their time delivering the training in their communities.
