The ACS Road To Recovery[®] program provides transportation to and from treatment for people who have cancer who do not have a ride or are unable to drive themselves.

Volunteer drivers donate thousands of hours of their time and the use of their cars so that thousands of patients across the country can receive the life-saving treatments they need.

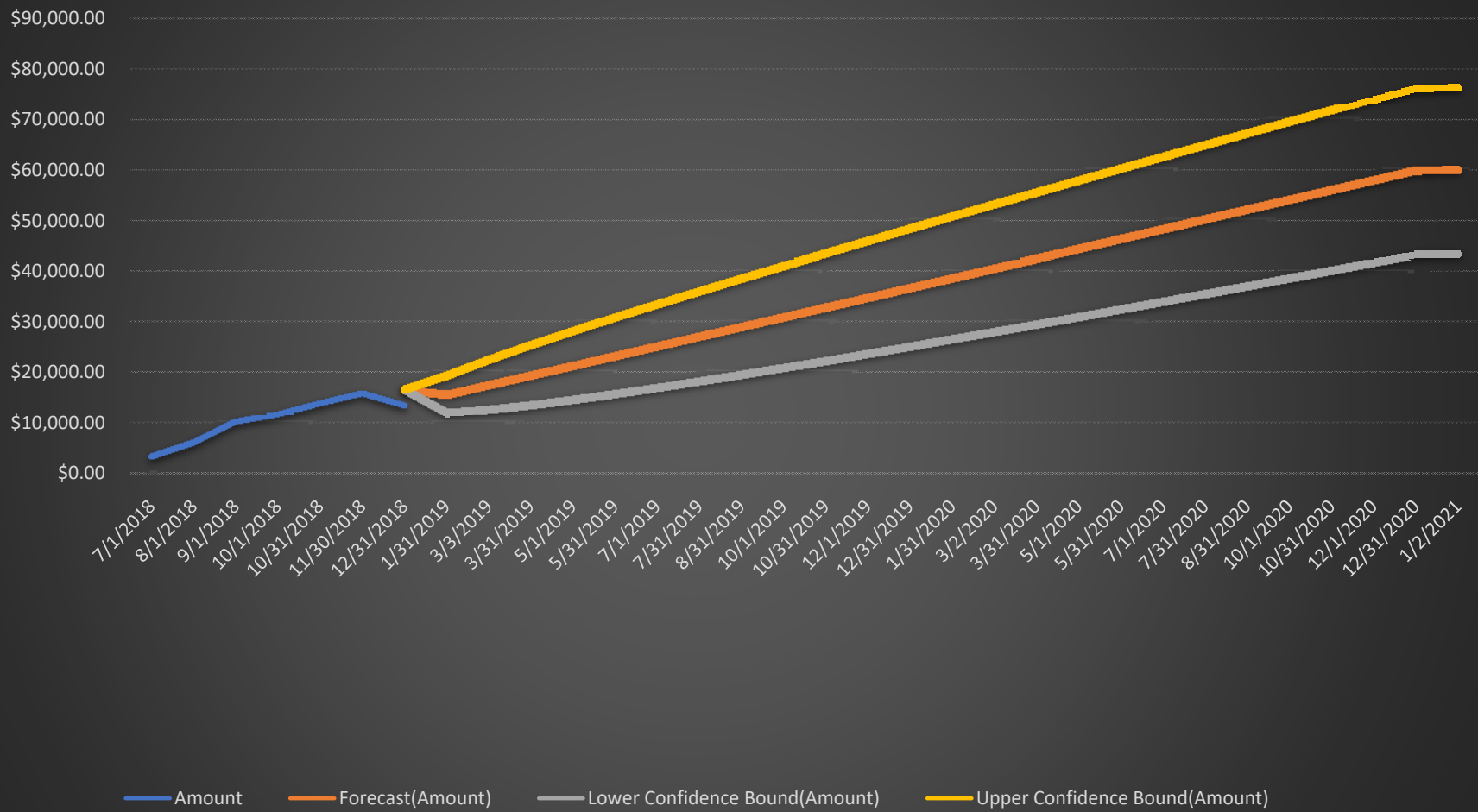
The *Getting There Guide* helps to bridge the transportation gap of local citizens with mobility challenges, helping them live as independently as possible.
